THE END TIMES

Today, the Gospel speaks to us of the final coming of the Son of Man. The liturgical year is about to end; the readings present the end of time to us.

We are asked to contemplate crucial aspects of our life: death, judgment, hell or heaven. We do not reflect on these in fear or without any future. We know that our future is coming and we recall that our preparation for New Born Child has started.

This future, this perspective, helps us to see that, for those who believe in God, there is always a new life. Jesus warns believers in God against any attitude of triumphalism, seeking external glory and confirming their value in human safeguards and successes. No external signs of faith are a measure of greatness, but a clinging to Jesus with love, especially when one runs out of success.

Let us think about all our spiritual exercises which we do every day. Can I say that they bring me closer to Jesus and strengthen my relationship with Him? Are there routines and habits that weaken my attachment to Jesus?

Jesus reminds me that the path of Christian calling leads through the cross of misunderstanding, accusations, rejection, even through loved ones. It will be an opportunity to testify to faith.

But He does not leave us in fear. Jesus, predicting trials and bad experiences on the path of faith, assures us of his closeness and tender protection. He is our first defender. He wants us to trust Him completely.

Today's Gospel finishes with a strong assurance that perseverance in faithfully clinging to Jesus will save our life. Let us pray all together for our parish that we will be a people who truly believe in Christ.
