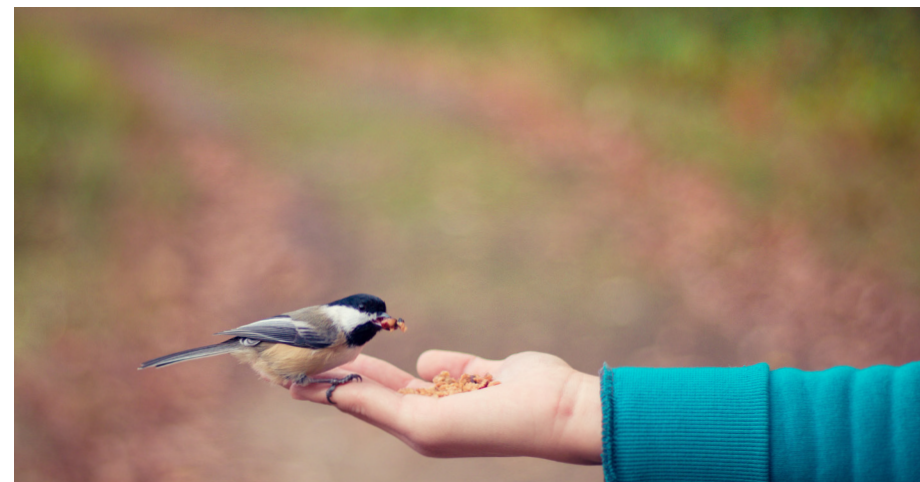

SET YOUR HEART FIRST ON GOD'S KINGDOM

“Do not worry about your life, what you will eat or drink; or about your body and how you are to clothe it”. When reading these words of Jesus, we may have the impression that this is an invitation not to worry about our life and not to take any responsibility for it. Is this really the point? Jesus does not ignore our concerns, problems or needs; they really matter to Him.

However, He warns us not to be preoccupied with them too much. Excessive concern about the future destroys our strength and paralyses our ability to act, which often become damaging for us. This attitude prevents true spiritual development, which should be listening to and following the word of God. If we are not trying first and foremost to follow God's word, we are being diverted from the most important task of Christianity. However, we can be comforted that Jesus does not leave us alone in this situation for he tells us “Set your hearts on God's kingdom first and on God's righteousness and all these other things will be given to you as well.” In this way, God invites us to consider our priorities. Christianity consists in putting God first and trusting that God will always care for us and give us what we need. God knows best what we really need and we must always put our first priority on God and our developing relationship with Him. I think that St Ignatius of Loyola helps us with a proper Christian understanding of how to do this. He says: “trust as if everything depends on God, act as if everything depends on you.”

So, we need to reflect on who we trust most in our lives. Is God at the centre of my life? Do I believe that God really is concerned for my well-being and will hear my prayers? Can I say with real honesty that I seek the Kingdom of God and His righteousness above all else?

Let us pray for the grace to deepen our faith and understanding of the message Jesus gives us in today's Gospel that if we set our hearts on God and God's righteousness before our concerns for anything else, then all the other things that we need will be given to us.
