THIS WEEK AT ST IGNATIUS

1st Lent Talk: This Lent the series of talks will be on "Understanding the Mass". Each Tuesday evening of Lent someone will talk about parts of the mass and help everyone present to deepen their understanding of what mass is all about. This coming Tuesday, the 7th of March at 7.15pm in the presbytery, the talk will be given by Fr David and is entitled, "An Overview and Introduction to the Mass". PARISH ITEMS AND EVENTS

Volunteers Needed: As most of you will know, for several years now we have offered a hot, sit-down lunch to homeless people on

Mondays and Fridays. For the last couple of months, this has had to be reduced to only having this meal available once a week, because of a lack of volunteers. If you would be willing to help out with the preparation and service of a hot meal for the homeless on Mondays, please give your name and telephone number to Fr David or Sr Eugenia. We especially need men to volunteer, though, of course, women would be more than welcome too.

Beggars Outside the Church: You will have noticed that on many Sundays recently there have been one or two beggars asking for money outside the church after masses. These people have been offered clothes and food but they only want money and Fr David suspects that they are likely to be "professional" beggars who take advantage of the generosity of others. Please do not give these people money. We have an extensive programme to help homeless people and we are always willing, in addition to giving food and clothing, to refer them to hostels for shelter and to medical services if needed. If you wish to support our work for the homeless and want to be sure that the money is used for those genuinely in need, please put your donations in the "poor box" in the Sacred Heart Chapel at the front of the church, near the sacristy. Thank you.
