

WORLD DAY OF THE POOR

Another of Pope Francis's great new ideas for the Church comes our way this Sunday. It's the first World Day of the Poor. In our parishes and communities, this day invites us to offer friendship, solidarity & welcome to the poorest of our sisters & brothers. Pope Francis asks us to pray together, especially the Our Father. It will be observed in many ways, including at Sunday Mass, in every country where there are catholic Christians. Many non-Catholic people of good will are marking it too.

On Sunday morning in St Peter's, Rome, the Holy Father will invite 4,000 poor & needy people, accompanied by volunteers from many lands including Spain & Poland. They will join Pope Francis at Mass. Following this, 1,500 of the visitors will eat lunch in the Pope Paul VI Hall, while the other 2,500 guests will be taken to lunch in some of the Catholic colleges, seminaries and charitable organisations near the Vatican. All week there has been a mobile clinic parked in St Peter's Square offering free specialised medical services to poor people. As Pope Francis said on announcing this Day, "it is my wish that... Christian communities will make every effort to create moments of encounter and friendship, solidarity and concrete assistance."

Material poverty is bad, to be resisted and combatted. Spiritual poverty is good, for it means that we know that everything comes from God. Some of us gathered here in the St Ignatius parish community know very well about material poverty & hardship, from personal experience and in our families. Others of us go out of our way, often quietly & unobtrusively, to offer the friendship, solidarity & welcome that Pope Francis is encouraging on this day. Our call, as followers of Christ, is to identify the gifts & talents that God has given us and to be thankful for those gifts, not by enriching ourselves, but by placing them at the service of others, especially the poorest among us. That's what today's Gospel is all about and that's what this World Day of the Poor is all about!
