St.Josephine Bakhita.

Saint Josephine Bakhita, whose memorial will be celebrated on Friday 8th Feb., inspired and is the patron Saint of the special refuge "Caritas Bakhita House". Josephine, who was canonised by Pope John Paul II in 2000, grew up in Sudan, and was kidnapped in 1877 when only 8 years old, walking barefoot for over 600 miles after which she was sold as a slave, living a harsh and difficult existence during which she was sold over 12 times.

Eventually she was looked after by Canossian Sisters in Venice, and was baptised and became a member of the religious order. In a spirit of remarkable generosity she said that she would be ready to forgive her kidnappers, since it was through the terrible events of her life that she came to discover Christ her Saviour.

Named in her honour, Caritas Bakhita House has been operating for over three years bringing relief to women rescued from the slavery of human trafficking. The team at Bakhita House offers women a range of services including emergency support, legal and financial assistance, mentoring, and help with accessing accommodation. Guests of Bakhita House benefit from the project's values and principles of action: Love – expressed in compassionate support and long term commitment; Respect – for the gift and dignity of each individual; Community – a welcome which creates friendship and belonging; Spirituality – nurtured by that joy in creative activity which lifts the spirit.

Up to the end of 2017 more than 75 women originating from 30 countries have been given shelter and assistance. In addition, there were six successful convictions of the traffickers under the "modern slavery act", based on evidence provided by the rescued women.

Bakhita House is blessed to have the assistance of over 50 volunteers to help in various kinds of pastoral care and other ministries, and relies on the donations of many people to continue their splendid work.

One young woman who has been helped recently wrote: "When I first came here I felt like a little girl, I felt powerless. Now I feel like a mature confident woman. Sometimes I feel sad, I miss my parents so much, but then I feel the staff are like my parents giving me support. Thank you so much for loving me, I appreciate that very much."

Let us thank the Lord for the excellent work being done at Bakhita House, and we pray for the staff and the guests for the healing power of Christ to be with them.

SETTLED STATUS:

Recently, the Government introduced a new scheme for E.U. people living in the U.K. by which they have to apply for "settled status". The "E.U. Settlement Scheme" requires all E.U. nationals & family members who want to stay in the UK after Britain leaves the E.U. to register before 30 June 2021. Although, under pressure, they waived the proposed £65 fee, this could still cause worry & concern for some families even though they may have lived here for many years, contributing to society & paying their social taxes. This scheme, already launched, will be fully in operation by 30th March. Fr.David would like to hear from anyone affected by or worried by these new rules.
