

## TODAY'S READINGS and RESPONSES

### Entrance Antiphon:

Blest be God the Father, and the Only Begotten Son of God, and also the Holy Spirit, for he has shown us his merciful love.

Alleluia, alleluia! Glory be to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit,

Since you are children of God, God has sent into your hearts the Spirit of his Son,  
the Spirit who cries out: Abba, Father.

All his life Saint Ignatius had a deep devotion to the Trinity, rooted in a powerful mystical experience during his time of conversion at Loyola and Manresa. It stayed with him. He could perceive the Trinity in all sorts of ways. As he eventually reached Rome, ready with the first companions to present themselves to the Holy Father for mission, once again he experienced the Trinity's presence. The Father placed him with the Son, carrying the Cross; Ignatius heard the Father's promise "I shall be favourable to you in Rome". Thus filled with the Spirit, they proceeded to St. Peter's, ready for whatever the Supreme Pontiff would ask of them.

In the *Spiritual Exercises*, Ignatius invites us to use our imaginations to be present to the Blessed Trinity gazing on the earth and on all of human history. The heart of the Trinity is pained by how far humanity has strayed from the Trinity's highest hopes for us, not least in how we have treated each other but also our common home, this planet. The Trinity sees much love & goodness on the earth but also much injustice, socially and environmentally. Imagine then the surge of divine love that becomes the Incarnation, as the very heart of God becomes a human heart, the Sacred Heart of Jesus, entering our reality where we most need it. We can pray this way too. Speak, directly to his heart, whatever words seem right; let him speak to you, with or without words.

What does the Trinity see, as they contemplate our world today? Creation, freely given to us, is despoiled and degraded by human action. As the Pope has said, "Everything is connected. The human environment and the natural environment deteriorate together". The Government's commitment this week to action on climate change is good, but it isn't enough. We must keep up the pressure; we must pray but also act so that our politicians will not only issue ambitious targets but ensure that these are enacted. The matter is urgent. Future generations, and the world's poorest people now, need us to act.
