## MOMENTS ON THE WAY

One fascinating feature of St.Luke's Gospel, from which we are reading most of the Sundays of this liturgical season, year C, is the idea of Journey. Saint Luke is the only evangelist to emphasise this theme. He was a superb writer, employing the journey motif in several different ways, all of which speak to our own experience of being travellers, a pilgrim people, on our journey towards the fullness of life.

At the end of Chapter 9, Luke showed how Jesus "turned, and set his face towards Jerusalem". Luke's greatest stories, including the much-loved Good Samaritan (14th July) and the delightful little story of Mary and Martha (21st July), happen while he and his band of disciples are "on the road". The victim of the mugging, whom the Samaritan helped when others wouldn't, was on his own journey while Jesus was offered a welcome break from his travel by these two sisters. For Jesus and his band, the destination is Jerusalem, which, in Luke's gospel, is both journey's end and starting-point. Jesus will embrace his Cross there but, from there, a new, everlasting journey commences—"to the ends of the earth", which Luke presents in the second part of his Gospel, the Acts of the Apostles. There too, the geographical journeys of Peter, Paul and the other Apostles show how Christianity spread outwards, in the power of the Spirit of the Risen Christ. We even know, from Acts, that some of the early Christians referred to their growing fellowship as The Way.

Luke and those who were first to hear his Gospel knew very well that the journey was a key pattern of the Biblical story. Abraham, Moses, the nomadic Patriarchs, the Exodus journey out of captivity and, led by Joshua, into the Promised Land, then the itinerant John the Baptist ; all are still part of our journey even now. And travelling with us, always, is the Risen Christ, accompanying us on the way.
