## ST. IGNATIUS OF LOYOLA—OUR PATRON

We are about to thank God for the gift of Ignatius and his patronage  
of our parish here that bears his name. We'll do that this year on  
Wednesday July 31st, the saint's feast-day and the date of his  
death, in Rome, in 1556. As Catholics and many other Christians  
have done for a long time, we think of the particular gifts of our  
special saints, our patrons, and we thank God for raising up these  
good people with these good gifts; sustenance and inspiration for us all.



Ignatius, born, we think, in 1491 in the Basque Country of Spain, was a minor  
nobleman, destined for a career in the army and at Court. By his own admission he  
was a rather dissolute character in his youth. Recovering from a battlefield injury,  
he began to learn the value of reflection and prayer, discovering that attention paid  
to those deep interior movements in the heart, and the various desires that we  
notice there, tell us much about God's call to us and how we respond. His mystical  
experiences over the following months and years eventually became the *Spiritual  
Exercises*, and they have shaped many a life ever since. *Continued page 3.*



Our patron Saint is known as the founder of the Jesuits (the Society of Jesus, who have the care of this parish) although not so many know that he is also the patron of retreats & retreat leaders. He and those first generations of Jesuits are also known as the great educators; not everyone knows that Ignatius was originally against opening schools and, for that matter, wasn't sure about taking on churches and parishes! His dream for the Order was that it be mobile, flexible and available; he worried about being too tied down. The Jesuits have always been a missionary Order. But he came to see, through the discernment of the *Spiritual Exercises*, what good could be done in these works.

Our patron Saint is a mystic much more than a heroic chivalrous soldier, as he's sometimes been shown. He is a man of the heart, encouraging us to look into our hearts and the heart of the world. Ignatius wants us to experience the Trinity in our hearts and in every aspect of our daily reality, as he did. For he knew, and we can learn, that God is to be found there.
