Today is **World Mission Sunday**.

Communion Antiphon: (*Psalm 32*) Behold, the eyes of the Lord are on those who fear him, who hope in his merciful love, to rescue them from death, to keep them alive in famine.

Starting here on 3rd November, a group for single young adults, aged around 18-35, who feel they would benefit from having direction about God's calling in their lives. *Lectio Divina*, prayerful reading of the Bible, is at its heart. The group meets monthly and there are individual meetings with a trained spiritual guide. Participants take time to listen to God speaking to their life.
