CHRIST OUR KING

Today, the Church's Liturgical Year comes to an end with the celebration of Jesus Christ Our King – King of the Universe. Jesus is the servant King – a King not of power, but of love and He reigns over the Kingdom of Love.

St Luke tells us, in his gospel today about the last moments of Jesus's life. He is abused by one of the criminals hanging there, "save yourself and us as well". But the other criminal rebuked him because he recognised Jesus as a good man and he cried out, "Jesus, remember me when you come into your Kingdom."

Pope Francis speaks powerfully of the importance of this Feast: "Today's Liturgy invites us to fix our gaze on Christ, the King of the Universe. Jesus brought about the Kingdom through His closeness & tenderness towards us. He is the shepherd. Jesus is not a King according to earthly ways. For Him to reign is not to command, but to obey the Father, to give Himself over to the Father, so that His plan of love & salvation may be brought to fulfilment. The Gospel teaches what Jesus' Kingdom requires of us: it reminds us that closeness and tenderness are the rule of life for us also. We need to be close in concrete ways to our brothers & sisters who ask for bread, clothing, acceptance, solidarity, catechesis. If we truly love them, we will be willing to share with them what is most precious to us: Jesus himself & His Gospel."

Today is also **National Youth Sunday**, when we are asked to pray for all our young people, that they will come to know and love Jesus Christ more each day. We pray that they will encounter Jesus through daily prayer and a life of service to their brothers and sisters, as Pope Francis urges them to do.

Finally, the words of a much loved hymn come to mind: 'This is our God, the Servant King, He calls us now to follow Him, to bring our lives as a daily offering of worship to the Servant King.'
