Parable of the Rich Man & Lazarus

The situation in our nation warrants a reminder of some of the basic threads of Catholic Social Teaching, about just wages, care for the poor, and an equitable distribution of wealth.

Pope Leo XIII made a historic contribution to the church's teachings in *Rerum Novarum (On the condition of Labour)* of 1891:

". . .by degrees it has come to pass that working people have been surrendered, isolated and helpless, to the hardheartedness of employers and the greed of unchecked competition."

Catholic doctrine reiterated the basic economic principles of Christianity, and notably affirmed the following: the right of property ownership, tempered by the duty to provide for the common good and to use that property for the benefit of others; a fair wage; charity towards the poor; freedom of association for workers. State intervention was permitted but had to follow the principle of subsidiarity, i.e. it should be restricted to matters that could not be settled by other competent authorities (family, associations, unions, local authorities). Some problems could only be dealt with at international level, by the competent economic and social authorities.

Since 1891, successive popes have published various updates to Rerum Novarum, dealing with issues such as international debt, the consequences of the collapse of communism, cross-border migration and financial crises. These popes, including Benedict XVI and now Pope Francis, have repeatedly proclaimed the importance of preserving human rights, the dignity of the human person, and personal freedom. Basic to the approach of every Catholic towards others must be the teachings and example of Christ himself. The parables have a powerful message, as relevant to today as when Christ first used them: care of the poor and the stranger, welcoming the sinner, forgiveness in the face of conflict, not being addicted to wealth or power.

"God is the richest of anyone. He is rich in compassion, in mercy. His riches do not impoverish anyone, do not create quarrels and divisions. It is a wealth that knows how to give, to distribute, to share". (Pope Francis, Angelus 31 July, 2022)
