NEXT WEEK: PALM SUNDAY AND HOLY WEEK

Let each one of us prepare for and look forward to the spiritual atmosphere of Holy Week, leading to the Easter Triduum. From Holy Thursday until Easter Sunday we will live the central days of the Liturgical Year, celebrating the mystery of the Passion, Death and Resurrection of the Lord. And we live this mystery every time we celebrate the Eucharist. When we go to Mass, we do not go only to pray, no: we go to renew, to bring about again, this mystery, the Paschal mystery. It is important not to forget this. It is as though we were to go to Calvary – it is the same – to renew, to bring about again the Paschal mystery. (Pope Francis, adapted)

So by selling their produce here on their behalf, this will prevent the Christians from leaving the country in search of better work opportunities, as a test survey from the bishops of Jerusalem reveals there are only forty -one thousand Christians left in the area.”
