From the two meetings these points emerge: Where we are doing well, and where we need to develop.

Doing well: A spirit of <u>welcome</u> to all, especially to visitors. The quality and involvement of our <u>celebrations</u>. The variety and effectiveness of our <u>homilies</u>. The variety and quality of <u>music and singing</u>. Our combination of <u>Diversity and Unity</u>. The parish staff <u>listen very well</u> to concerns. We <u>reach out</u> to people in need. We make our facilities <u>available</u> to all. We are more than <u>40 nations</u>. We have a <u>variety</u> of Jesuits and Religious. We have an <u>impressive</u> and <u>beautiful</u> church. We show <u>strong and united faith</u>.

Need to develop and strengthen: Try to be <u>more available</u> to one another and to new people. Find ways to retain our young people in the <u>post-Confirmation</u> years. Develop more <u>leadership roles</u>. All of us could be more involved in <u>evangelization</u>. Some more <u>bible study</u>. More Formation in the <u>Catholic Faith</u> and more <u>prayer groups</u>. <u>Training for ministers</u>. Movement regarding the <u>wasteground</u> with <u>more parking</u>. Encourage <u>Divine Mercy</u>.

Reflection on these many points will continue in the coming months. I am grateful to all who have participated so far—it really helps to hear the views of as many people as possible. Please remember that the Jesuits and our various teams of volunteers and ministers are here to help you, our parishioners.
