

## FROM OUR PARISH PRIEST:

Please forgive my 4th (and final!) newsletter notification (we are required to inform you of the change of use of "Growing in Faith" funds for 4 consecutive weeks). The parish project that formed the appeal in 2015 was to redevelop the waste ground next to our church, with the possibility of a new hall.

It has become clear to me that the funds available were not adequate for such a project. However, I have identified a clearly achievable project, within the budget and which will bring considerable benefit to our parishioners.

For anyone who uses our church in the late afternoon or evening, or on cloudy days, you will have realised that the church's lighting is inadequate. In October of 2018 three of the main lights failed and the sanctuary was left in semi darkness. Since then we have been using some temporary lighting.

A reputable church lighting scheme designer has prepared a thorough brief, with excellent visuals, and is ready to go ahead with a detailed tendering document and application to the HCC for permission to carry out the work, with an estimate cost "in the area of £100,000". I hope to carry out the installation during the summer.

The scheme/design is excellent: it will provide excellent lighting for the congregation, many of whom sit in semi-darkness in the aisles; it will bring out the aesthetic beauty and details of the building, and will use the latest wiring and LED low-wattage equipment. Thus it will be safer, longer-lasting, and will save a considerable amount of electricity, and so representing an obvious start towards implementation of one of our Jesuit apostolic preferences (caring for our common home). With continuing improvements in technology, fittings will be easily replaced in the coming years.

The parish finance committee have unanimously agreed to the change. The Diocese has also agreed that this is a beneficial change. 
