TRINITY SUNDAY

The first reading today from the book of Exodus gives us a description of a very ancient understanding of who God is: an unseen and unknown power, in existence back before the dawn of time itself. This was the way the people of Israel began to know who God is: they would never declare the name of God because that would shatter the mystery and they feared that they would lose God's favour. For them God was an incredible force of power and of protection, of love and strength. A God of tenderness and compassion, slow to anger, rich in kindness and faithfulness. It is in Jesus Christ that God finally has a name, a face, a body, and a human life. Right from the moment of the birth of Christ, Christians can say that we know who God is. And we know more about God because of the Gospels, because of the teachings and writings of the early church, because of the way in which the Spirit of God, sent to the Church at the first Pentecost, continues to lead us and guide us. In the Gospel Jesus tells Nicodemus about the full and overwhelming impact of who God is, and how this is truly God For Us. The Son of God endured death on a cross so that the world would be saved. Christ is truly present among us in one another in this Church today, in the scripture that we listen to, and in the sacrament of the Eucharist, and that means that God who created us and continues to love us is with us here and now, and wants to go on loving us and helping us in our lives. And God does that often through the relationships that we have with one another, through his gift of love. Today's feast reminds us that God is truly present within us. And God wants us to have relationships, that show forth the love, power and the presence of God to the world. We pray to God, Father Son and Spirit, to fill us with the graces and blessings that we need to draw us closer to God and to one another.
