HARVEST SUNDAY

A landowner went out to hire some workers for his vineyard. He took on new workers at the start of the day and three more times later in the day. He promised them all a fair wage. The workers who arrived first expected to be paid more than the workers who arrived near to the end of the day. After all, they were hot and tired and had worked very hard all day, while some of the others have only worked for one hour. How did the workers who had been hired first feel when they saw that everyone was being paid the same wage?

But we Catholics are invited by the parable to think differently from the way the world thinks! The story is not about fair wages but about universal salvation through Baptism. We are not earning wages from God. We offer God our best and we believe that God, who has made a covenant with us, will reward us out of a heart overflowing with generosity.

We will fail, we will sin, we will ask for forgiveness, we will hope for eternal life as the great gift of our baptism. That is enough.
