NEW JESUIT PRIEST:

Please welcome our new Jesuit
Priest, Carlos Chuquihara, ordained
Saturday at Farm Street Church. He
celebrates Mass here at St Ignatius
Church 11am today. The Mass will
be followed by a Reception. All are
invited to attend.

Fr. Carlos is 37 years old and was
born in Lima, Peru. He moved to

England in 2006 to study Biomedical Science at the University
of Sheffield. After finishing his studies and working for a year,
he entered the Society of Jesus in September 2012.

After taking his first vows in Birmingham, Carlos studied
philosophy in Toronto, worked with young people in Galway
and London, and studied theology in Paris. In this last city, he
was ordained deacon in May 2023. Over the previous year,
Carlos was sent to Madrid (Comillas Pontifical University) to
study Ignatian Spirituality. Fr. Carlos will be with us from mid-

NEXT WEEK: Sea Sunday

Sea Sunday is an opportunity for us to remember and say prayers for all the brave men and women who work at sea to make sure we have all that we need. Join us to celebrate Sea Sunday and raise funds which help to provide essential support and services for seafarers who often work in dangerous and lonely conditions.

We might not realise it, but we all depend on seafarers. 90% of everything we use, from food and medication to cars and household furnishings, reaches us via the sea.

Your support for The Mission to Seafarers enables us to care for the shipping industry's greatest assets: its people. Being a seafarer is tough. Crews can spend months away working long hours with little respite or contact with home.

On top of the daily pressures, the threat of piracy, shipwreck and abandonment are ever present for the men and women who serve us at sea. This challenging job has become even harder. Increased restrictions and lockdowns implemented during the COVID-19 pandemic saw many seafarers working beyond their contract end, and unfortunately, these restrictions continue to impact shore leave today.

Most recently, attacks and threats to ships traversing the Red Sea have added to the plight of seafarers. Amid these challenges, The Mission to Seafarers has been a constant source of practical support and reassurance. Through our teams in 200 ports, we've been supporting the 1.89 million unseen keyworkers who have helped to keep the economy afloat and transport the essentials we need to survive.
